# ATKMB get first point vs Mumbai

## Lack Of Finishing Forces Ferrando's Side To Share Spoils With Holders

ATK Mohan Bagan may have earned their first point against Mumbai City FC in the ISL history, but Juan Ferrando's side had only themselves to blame for not getting over the top despite taking an early lead and looking for several opportunities to kill the game as a contest on Thursday.

Hugo Boumous swooped on a defensive blunder and set the platform for David Williams to give ATK Bagan a lead in the ninth minute.

But Mumbai City got the equaliser against the run of play when Pritham Kotai headed Bipin Singh's cross into his own goal in the 24th minute. ATK Bagan continued to dominate but their lack of finishing forced them to eventually settle for the 1-1 stalemate at the Nehru Stadium in Patoda.

Surprisingly, Ferrando kept Kiyasu Nassiri — whose starved in a sunning cameo role to sink SC East Bengal

with a hat-trick in the last match — on the bench until the 45th minute. But unlike his super hero five days ago, the son of Jamshil Nassiri failed to produce an impact of similar magnitude as ATKMB's hopes for breaking into the top four remained unfulfilled.

They are now placed fifth

such a ferocious mindset that they left the rivals gasping for breath right from the beginning.

With Williams spearheading an attacking line and the trio of Boumous, Liston Cola and Manvir Singh providing more fluidity and firepower from behind, Mumbai City backline was living on its edge and kept committing a series of unforced errors, one of which led to the opening goal.

Mumbai full-back Rahul Bheke stopped Cola in his tracks on the left wing and referee Rahul Kumar Gupta kept the flow of the game uninterrupted. Mountara Fall received the ball and passed it to Ahmed Jahouh on the edge of the box. But Boumous reacted quickly to snatch it and headed it into the goal.

Mumbai, however, came back into the contest on the back of another defensive blunder at the end of the

park when ATKMB captain Pritham tried to clear Bipin Singh's cross but ended up giving it straight into his own net, giving goalkeeper Amir Singh a no-choice.

Despite conceding the goal, ATKMB continued to dominate the proceedings and their relentless pressure on the Mumbai box opened up a number of opportunities. Williams could not keep his head on target from close range, but he was unable to score.

ATKMB players could have killed the game as a contest during that period but, their lack of finishing over Mumbai City's breathing space and an opportunity of changing the script in the second half was squandered. Amir Singh took an alert and new signing Lalzanu Chhangte came calling twice with decent attempts from distance.

# Snow & steady: Is it time to break the ice?

Beijing Friday's start of the Beijing Winter Olympics will turn attention away from criticism over human rights, which China rejects, a spokesperson for the organising committee told Reuters on the eve of the opening ceremony.

Several countries including the United States and Britain have announced a diplomatic boycott of the Games over China's rights record, including its treatment of mostly Muslim Uyghurs in its Xinjiang region, which the United States deems genocide.

The so-called China human rights issue is a lie made up by people with ulterior motives, Zhai Wenguo, spokesperson for the Beijing Games, told Reuters in an interview on Thursday when asked if such criticism had undermined the Games.

"I want to emphasise that the Olympics is a great spectacle and sports have no borders across the world. From the current situation, many countries and athletes have expressed their support for the Beijing Winter Olympics," he said.

The opening ceremony is scheduled to begin at 20:00 local time on Friday at the Bird's Nest stadium, the main venue where Beijing's 2008 Games began, making the Chinese capital the first city to host both the Summer and Winter Games.

Due to Covid-19, the Olympics are taking place in a "closed loop" segregating competitors and other personnel from the Chinese public, and spectators will be limited to smaller groups of selected attendees.

Zhai expressed confidence in the measures, which include testing for everyone after organisers reported 55 new infections among Games personnel for Feb. 2, the highest daily total to date.

# 21 Grand Slams not enough, says Nadal

Australian Open champion Rafa Nadal said he would love to win his career with more Grand Slam titles than rivals Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic but thinks he will have to secure more than 21 to do so.

Nadal fought back to beat Daniil Medvedev in the final at Melbourne Park on Sunday to move one ahead of Federer and Djokovic and claim men's record major title. "I have no idea what number of Grand Slams I will have," Nadal told reporters at his academy in Mallorca on Wednesday. "I want to be the one with the most majors out of the three of us, I would love that, but I'm not obsessed, absolutely not. Whatever comes is well come and I don't think it's enough to be honest. But you never know what will happen in the future."

World number one Djokovic did not feature at the Australian Open af-

ter being diagnosed with COVID-19, but he is expected to return to the country due to his COVID-19 vaccination status, while Federer was ruled out following a third knee surgery last year.

Nadal, who missed much of last season due to a nagging foot injury, added that it still hurts when he plays but his game was a higher level now. "This (the win) has given me a huge boost of confidence to move forward," said the Spaniard.

**Federer, Nadal plan to play Laver Cup**

Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal both say they will play in the next edition of the Laver Cup, Federer, who has been sidelined since July because of an injured knee, and Nadal,

fresh off earning his men's record Grand Slam title at the Australian Open, said in a statement on Thursday they will represent Team Europe in London on Sept. 23-25.

"I'm really looking forward to getting back into competition later this year and Laver Cup is very much part of my plan," said Federer, whose management company founded the competition. Federer said Nadal messaged him last year suggesting they play doubles together again in the Laver Cup.

"If we were to possibly share the one cup, this would be a double pairing, then that would be a truly special experience for us both at this stage in our careers," Nadal said.
